We will also be having some kids attending our Expo with their adult leaders. Mike got the idea to invite the kids, ages from 10 to 15 years, to come and learn some prac-



#### "Surprise find on June 22, 2016!! " By Ruth Schneider, Lake City

My bluebird trail is located in Frontenac State Park. My husband Ed maintains the 80 houses in the Park and I have a trail of 20 houses, a mixture of PVC, Peterson and box houses. We have five other people who help the three other trails.

The location has been a good producer of tree swallows. This PVC house had 6 tree swallow hatchings in it the week before. I could smell the deterioration of the nest before I got very near it. To my shock, there was a large bull snake



hanging out of the nest box and he was dead! He had gone through one of the ventilation holes near the top of the house. It looked like he got stuck after consuming the hatchings and was unable to back out. I had to go to the Park Office to get help from one of the Park assistants. She pulled the snake out of the house.

I checked the house the next week. There was an empty nest with lots of bird poop. We have since moved the pair of houses to a more open area.

#### "2016 Bluebird Recovery Program"

The reported number of bluebirds fledged in Minnesota for 2016 is **15,709**. Down about 9% from 2015, but up from the two prior years. Out-of-State Members from Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Michigan, North Dakota, Ohio and Wisconsin fledged 2,359 bluebirds. Making a grand total of **18,068** bluebirds fledged in 2016 from nestboxes provided and monitored by BBRP members.

Congratulations members and a sincere thank you for your constant dedication to Bluebirds. Each Bluebird enjoys the nest box you provide. Your efforts on the trails is greatly appreciated. By working together we are, "Bringing back Bluebirds for Future Generations!"

<u>Four counties</u>: Dakota, Fillmore, Hennepin and Rice each fledged over 1,000 bluebirds.

These counties produced 57% of the Minnesota Grand Total

Minnesota BBRP members submitted 415 reports with the following results.

19,687 Eggs Laid 16,506 Bluebirds hatched

15,709 Bluebirds fledged

**BBRP members outside of Minnesota** submitted 12 reports with the following results.

3,106 Eggs Laid 2,538 Bluebirds hatched

2,359 Bluebirds fledged

Total bluebirds reported fledged <u>18,068</u> (Minnesota and Out-of-State)

#### THANK YOU FOR REPORTING

The numbers of reports submitted for 2016 was 415, down by 6% from 2015 (443). By reporting your results, you are providing the data from which the above information is compiled. They also provide feedback to the organization on what is happening with monitored trails. Your reports give us information on issues and concerns that need to be addressed and what is working well.

When it is time to report, give a friendly reminder to fellow bluebirders to submit their yearend trail reports. Bluebirding is a continual learning experience for trail monitors. Take time to visit with other bluebirders, compare your trail experiences and you may be surprised at what you will learn from each other.

## 2016 Fledged Bluebirds by County








